An Introduction

The journey so far

Healthwatch Rochdale is the independent champion for people who use health and social care services in the Rochdale borough. Our role is to collect and listen to local people's experiences and views of health and care services and use this feedback to help improve services. We have been operationally independent for over 4 years.

Healthwatch Rochdale is one of 152 local Healthwatch organisations established throughout England on 1 April 2013 under the provisions of the Health and Social Care Act 2012. The remit of local Healthwatch covers all publicly funded social care and health services for both adults and children. There is a dual role to champion the rights of users of social care and health services and to hold the system to account for how well it engages with the public.

Our purpose

- ► Gathering views and understanding the experiences of people who use services, carers and the wider community
- ▶ Making people's views known
- Promoting and supporting the involvement of people in the commissioning and provision of local care services and how they are scrutinized
- ► Recommending investigation or special review of services via Healthwatch England or directly to the Care Quality Commission (CQC)
- Providing information (signposting) about access to services and support for making informed choice
- Making the views and experiences of people known to Healthwatch England (and to other Healthwatch organisations) and providing a steer to help it carry out its role as national champion.
- Referrals to NHS Complaints Advocacy

We also have a statutory role on the Strategic Place Board

- Production of transparent external work programmes to enable and ensure accountability to those we serve



Our People



We have a board of Directors made up of people who live and/or work locally. All board members have knowledge and experience of health and social care services as well as strategic knowledge. The Board is responsible for the overall governance of the organisation including setting strategy, agreeing policy and overseeing delivery of the work plan. The board has two sub-committees, HR and Finance, they report into full board on a quarterly basis and are chaired by board members.

The Advisory Group is to ensure that the views and experiences of Rochdale residents in relation to health and social care are communicated to the Healthwatch Rochdale Board so that its decision-making processes can be built upon and enhanced.

Our staff deliver the work programme. They have a wide range of skills and experience in engagement and involvement, health and social care delivery and health service commissioning.

Our volunteers support the operational team in the delivery of the work programme. The volunteers are local people who use health and social care services and who have a passion to help us improve patient experience.

Our service users are at the heart of everything we do. We use their feedback to ensure there is a better health and social care experience for everyone in Rochdale.

We have built strong partnerships with a wide range of stakeholders while still maintaining our independence. Our key partners are: Commissioners of services, Providers of services, Local Authority, Voluntary and Third sector, Education and Local businesses
