

Judith joins us with a wealth of knowledge of the Rochdale borough and is passionate about access to mental health services and homelessness. Share your views on Pharmacy Services

We are asking local residents to share their experience of using pharmacy services to understand how well they are working for you.

Pharmacy services are taking on a bigger role in looking after people's health and care needs.

You can visit your pharmacy for advice, to buy over the counter medication and collect your prescriptions.

Some pharmacies are open evenings and weekends and as qualified healthcare professionals the pharmacist can offer clinical advice and tell you if you need to see your GP or another healthcare professional.

You don't need an appointment and some offer private rooms so you can speak in private to the pharmacist.

There are a range of pharmacy providers across the Rochdale borough and Healthwatch Rochdale want to hear people's experiences of using these services to identify what is working well and



where improvements need to be made.

The anonymised findings will be shared with health & social care decision makers and those responsible for community pharmacies. Recommendations for improvement will be made.

Out In The Community

Over the last few months Healthwatch Rochdale have been busy attending community groups and hosting events.



Coffee Rockers

It was a pleasure to attend the Coffee Rockers afternoon at St George's Church Hall, hosted by local care organisation Home Instead. The session is for elderly residents of the Rochdale borough and included a quiz, live singer, dancing and even a conga line! We listened to feedback about GP surgeries, ophthalmology, and repeat prescriptions. We also gave information about Rochdale Advocacy Together Hub who help people with making a complaint about local NHS services.

Free Art 4 All

Touchstones Rochdale very kindly allowed us to use a gallery space to hold a creative arts and crafts day. We welcomed people from the borough and beyond to join us to make cards with one of our volunteers, Elizabeth, create bunting, mindfulness colouring and making slime. We shared information about the work we do and the volunteering opportunities available.

GP Focus Group

We co-hosted a focus group with HMR Circle and their service users to hear the experiences of elderly residents using GP digital services, apps and websites. We also had discussions around pharmacies, Social Prescribing and appointment waiting times. We then all had a lovely lunch together with a choice of either sausage and mash or Thai green curry. Thanks to HMR Circle's Chef and The Strand at Kirkholt where we held the event.

You said, we did

Want to know what happens after you contact us with your feedback?

Here are just a few actions we have taken after speaking to members of the public.

Hospital Discharge

You contacted us and told us about being discharged from hospital without a needed care package.

We contacted local patient services at NHS Greater Manchester Integrated Care, discharge nurses and PALS. Within 24 hours the patient was visited by occupational therapy and specific adaptions were offered in the person's home to accommodate their needs. We also encouraged the service user to provide their feedback to newly formed Greater Manchester Integrated Care Partnership patient services.



Menopause

You told us about your frustrations with the available support for those going through the menopause.

We have recently launched a survey to gather further information and the anonymised results will be used to make recommendations to those responsible for providing health & care services.

We have launched a new survey asking local people to share their experience of menopause/ perimenopause with us.

In the UK it is estimated that around 1 in 3 people are either currently going through or have reached the menopause with symptoms including anxiety, mood swings, brain fog, hot flushes and irregular periods. This period of life can impact work, family & personal life.

This piece of work follows our Advisory Group's decision to try and gain a better understanding of local people's experience of menopause/perimenopause following feedback that we have received. (For more info on the work of our Advisory Group see page 13). We want to understand how this affects local people and the support & treatment available to you.

Our short survey lets you share your experience quickly & easily. We are also looking to speak with people who are willing to share their story in more detail to gain a better understanding of their experience.

We are here to listen to local people and really want to hear how menopause has affected them. Telling us how well services have worked for you and what could have made things better can be used to help us make recommendations for change.
